Housing Help

Many programs exist to help Pennsylvania residents who are struggling with their mortgage or rent payments, and my office is here to connect you with them.

Pennsylvania Homeowners Assistance Fund: For Pennsylvania homeowners experiencing mortgage delinquency, default, foreclosure, displacement, and utility disconnection due to hardships caused by the pandemic. This program provides grants for mortgage payments, housing-related expenses, and past-due utility bills. **Applications open now!** *pahaf.org* | 1-888-987-2423

Property Tax/Rent Rebate: For Pennsylvanians ages 65+, widows and widowers ages 50+, and people with disabilities ages 18+ living on limited incomes. This program provides grants for property tax and rent payments. Apply by June 30! mypath.pa.gov | 1-888-222-9190

Philly First Home Program: For first-time homebuyers purchasing a home in Philadelphia. This program provides grants up to \$10,000 to reduce the principal and cover down payments and closing costs. **Applications open now!** *phila.gov/dhcd* | **215-686-9749**

Grants for Our Neighborhoods

Philadelphia residents deserve to live in a city where their needs for inclusive public spaces, thriving cultural and educational institutions, and strong community organizations are met.

This spring I announced \$17.8 million in grants for local projects throughout our District! Here are just a few of the projects that my office has helped fund:

- \$1,000,000 to the Arch Street United Methodist Church for internal renovations and external restorations.
- \$1,000,000 to Historic Philadelphia Inc. for new public restroom facilities at Franklin Square.
- \$1,500,000 to the New Kensington Community Development Corporation for the redevelopment of Kensington Avenue.
- \$1,000,000 to the Salvation Army for the revitalization of its Red Shield Family Residence.
- \$2,500,000 to the William Way LGBT Community Center for renovations to enhance accessibility and promote community.

Over the past six months, I've secured nearly \$60 million for local projects that will benefit our communities right now, and for years to come. Jobs With Dignity

Around the country, and around our city, we are seeing a strong resurgence of unionization efforts! After more than two years of hardship under the pandemic, workers are coming together to demand better working conditions for themselves, their colleagues, and all workers.

In Harrisburg: I'm pushing for legislation that will protect workers from misclassification and wage theft.

In Our District: I've been proud to stand alongside workers from the Philadelphia Museum of Art, from the University of the Arts, and from coffee shops and local hospitals.



Philadelphia is a labor town. Philadelphians know that when workers are provided with familysustaining wages, good benefits, safe work environments, and job security, our communities flourish.

A Powerful Community Votes

Pennsylvania holds two elections a year, every year! Each election is a chance to make sure your voice is heard. You can vote by mail, or in person at your polling location. In the upcoming November general election, we will vote for our U.S. Senator, U.S. Congressperson, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and State Representative.

From the Floor

In Harrisburg, I'm committed to introducing, supporting, and passing legislation that meets the real needs of people throughout our state. Here are some of the bills and resolutions that I've introduced this year.

The Whole-Home Repairs Act: \$50,000 to Repair, Update, and Weatherize Your Home

In March, I introduced the Whole-Home Repairs Act (*Senate Bill 1135*), a groundbreaking bipartisan bill that establishes a one-stop shop for home repairs and weatherization while creating new, family-sustaining jobs in a growing field.

Hundreds of thousands of Pennsylvanians are living in aging, unsafe homes because they can't afford repairs. I'm proud to have introduced this bill with every single Democratic Senator and five Republican Senators signed on as co-sponsors.

The Whole-Home Repairs Act works by doing three things:

- It gives you up to \$50,000 to fix your home.
- It makes sure you have an advocate who will help you access all the support you need.
- It creates local jobs and boosts training programs by providing stipends to trainees.

We can fight housing scarcity, community displacement and instability, and the deterioration of our homes all at once by passing the Whole-Home Repairs Act.

Right now, our state government has billions of dollars from the American Rescue Plan, and billions more from a historic budget surplus. This is our moment to demand real, permanent investment in our communities.

Additional Legislation

NURSING HOME RESIDENT PROTECTIONS: This Spring, I joined my colleague, Senator Maria Collett, to announce a suite of legislation to bring transparency and accountability to the nursing home industry so that we can **put care first**!

Nursing homes across Pennsylvania are in crisis. It's long past time for an honest, public conversation about funding our longterm care industry. Pennsylvanians deserve to age with dignity, families deserve to know their loved ones are receiving the best quality care, and staff deserve the resources they need to provide it. **COVID-19 DAY OF REMEMBRANCE:** On behalf of the 45,000 Pennsylvanians who lost their lives to COVID-19, and on behalf of everyone who is grieving a loved one, **I announced a resolution to designate March 18 as a statewide day of remembrance for those who have died from COVID-19**.

This resolution was a suggestion of my Constituent Services Representative Kimberly West, who lost her mother, Delores Hawthorne West, and who has worked tirelessly in our office to make our vaccine events successful and joyful.

REGIONAL GREENHOUSE GAS INITIATIVE: On April 23, 2022, Pennsylvania entered the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI), a program by Northeast and Mid-Atlantic states to reduce greenhouse gas emissions while generating economic growth.

Pennsylvania is an energy state. Joining RGGI means Pennsylvania will prevent hundreds of premature deaths from air pollution, infuse our economy with money and jobs, and lay the groundwork for lower utility bills and energy burdens. This is part of the path to a new green economy in which communities and working people have what they need to succeed.


