A Note From Nikil

Dear Neighbor,

As Senator, it is my responsibility, my honor, and my joy to champion our communities. There is so much to celebrate: across our region workers in every sector

– in our coffee shops, in museums, in our hospitals and universities, and in our nursing homes – are standing up for their collective rights. After decades of mistreatment, workers are fighting for, and winning, just compensation, good working conditions, and benefits to care for themselves and their families so that they can continue to provide the labor that fuels our city.

Pennsylvania's Commonwealth Court has ruled on what all of us in Philadelphia know to be true: our current school funding structure is broken, our system unjust and unconstitutional. Our demands for more for our school communities are fortified as we push onward.

Calls for housing to be recognized as a foundational right have become so loud that they can no longer be ignored. Last year we fought for, and won, the first-in-the nation Whole-Home Repairs Program to help households across our state repair, weatherize, and adapt their homes to be healthy and safe. This year, our work continues – we're not finished until all Pennsylvanians, in every county, have what we need to make our homes whole.

This is a moment that has more than its share of hardships – persistently low wages in the face of skyrocketing inflation, communities grieving from gun violence, and a state legislature reluctant to take the big actions we need against our climate crisis. As always, it is up to us. We keep showing up. We keep fighting alongside each other so that our communities have the resources, the safety, and the support we all need. It is an honor to be in this work with you.

Whole-Home Repairs is sweeping the state! Nearly every county in the state applied to administer this program to residents, meaning that 99% of Pennsylvania residents live in counties where Whole-Home Repairs funds will be available. Right now, these funds are making their way to county administrators. Whole-Home Repairs funding will start supporting home repairs and training programs this coming summer.

THE WHOLE-HOME REPAIRS PROGRAM:

- Provides up to \$50,000 to repair and weatherize homes throughout Pennsylvania.
- Allocates support staff to help people access the assistance they need in the order they need it.
- Funds training and preapprenticeship programs to build up the local workforce needed to meet the demand.

Important Right Now

Public Money for Public Good - Investment in Our Communities

Since taking office in December 2020, I've secured more than \$100 million in grants for local projects throughout our District. Our city and all of us who make our homes here deserve the resources we need so that everyone can thrive. These are some of the recent grants we've won for the district:

- \$247,000 to the Cambodian Association of Greater Philadelphia to reduce violence and support survivors and impacted communities.
- \$131,469 to Murphy Recreation Center to update the outdoor basketball courts for this community anchor.
- \$3,027,015 to New Kensington Community **Development Corporation** for new housing and to renovate existing buildings to increase the number of homes.
- \$2,500,000 to William Way LGBT Community Center for accessibility renovations, expanded services, and additional space for community, connection, and joy.

SP TLIGHT ON SERVICES

We're here to help! On the last page of this newsletter is a list of services my office offers to our neighbors. Below are some of those most in demand:

PROPERTY TAX/RENT REBATE

For Pennsylvanians ages 65+, widows and widowers ages 50+, and people with disabilities ages 18+ with limited incomes. This program provides grants for property tax and rent payments. Applications due June 30!

SEPTA SENIOR PASSES

Pennsylvanians ages 65+ can ride all of SEPTA for free! This includes the Market-Frankford line, the Broad Street line, and all buses, trolleys, and regional rail lines in PA. All you need is your free SEPTA Key Senior ID Card. My team can help with applications and process renewals in our district offices.

UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION

If you are having trouble navigating the unemployment system or if you've run into a road block, contact us for help.

From the Senate Floor

I'm committed to legislation that recognizes, supports, and provides for the people of Pennsylvania, with a focus on civil rights, cultural recognition, and meeting real material needs. Here are some of my legislative initiatives this year.

2023 - 2024 Budget Priorities

Pennsylvania's budget must be passed each year by the end of June. I'm fighting for our government to prioritize the resources our communities need to stay safe and to be healthy:



- Increased funding for schools throughout our Commonwealth. We know that the way our schools are funded is unjust; now we fight for the investment that our children deserve.
- Support for our burgeoning green economy. There are decades of work ahead for these industries of the future, and now is the time to invest so that we can provide long-term, family-sustaining jobs across our state.

Diwali as a State Holiday

Known as the "festival of lights," Diwali is a time of renewal for more than six million Americans. The five-day festival marks a time of celebration and deep cultural significance for those who take part. I am proud to join my colleague, Senator Greg Rothman, in introducing bipartisan legislation to make Diwali an official state holiday in Pennsylvania.

Our Commonwealth is home to nearly 200,000 South Asian residents – approximately 158,000 of whom are Indian American. Every year, thousands of Pennsylvanians join in Diwali's celebration of light, reflection, and gathering at temples, houses of worship, and community centers across the Commonwealth. The festival deserves official recognition.

LGBTQ Policy Win

No matter who we are or who we love, all of us deserve the freedom to move through the world and live our lives safely and without fear of harm. Last December, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission issued a decision to allow the Pennsylvania Human Relations Commission to recognize "sex" as inclusive of sexual orientation and gender identity – a major victory that extends crucial protections to jobs, housing, and public accommodations to LGBTQ Pennsylvanians.

This decision is unprecedented. It is lifesaving. And in our current political climate, it is fragile. With Senator Steve Santarsiero, I've introduced legislation to enshrine these protections into law to prevent future misinterpretation – and future harm. The passage of this legislation is an essential next step for a safer, more equitable world.

Resolution to Recognize William Still Week



William Still is known as the Father of the Underground Railroad. With my colleague Senator Art Haywood, I've introduced a resolution to recognize the second week of February as William Still Week.

Born the youngest of 18 children and raised in the Jersey pinelands by parents who had been enslaved, Still moved to Philadelphia as a young man with nothing. He taught himself to read and write and shortly became clerk of the Pennsylvania Anti-Slavery Society.

Still helped expand the vital system of transportation routes and safe houses that made up the Underground Railroad. At a time when the Fugitive Slave Law threatened anyone who didn't participate in the capture of Black Americans who escaped, Still's work was an act of resistance.

We owe much of our knowledge of the Underground Railroad to Still's careful records, which show the creativity and genius that conductors like Still, and the people they assisted, used to build pathways to freedom.

Around the District and in the Community


When we're not in Harrisburg, my team and I travel throughout the district to support the work done by the amazing residents, communities, organizations, and small businesses of the First Senatorial District!
